Responsibility for all clinical aspects of the Unit, including supervision of registrars (residents), senior house officers (doctors in their first year post-internship), and medical students in their provision of medical care, as well as aspects such as ensuring that medical staff adequately communicate the nature of the illness and its therapy to patient and family; referral of patients to specialised units, and communication or mediation between these members of staff, allied professionals and nursing staff.

As a consultant on intake days, Dr De Villiers took personal responsibility for patient care, and conducted post-intake ward-rounds the next day. Adequate follow-up of patients also fell under his care, as well as the Unit's out-patient service. His responsibility included overseeing effective clinical record-keeping.

### 1988 - 1994

Head of the Paediatric and Adolescent Diabetes Service, including the Children's Diabetes Clinic, Johannesburg Hospital, which cares for both in- and out-patients. It delivers multidisciplinary, comprehensive care to the patient whose illness is seen not in isolation as a problem requiring medical treatment only, but in the context of the whole child and his/her family, as well as the wider social environment. Patient care is maintained by a team of health professionals, including doctors, tertiary care nurses, social workers and dieticians. Patients and parents manifest a very positive attitude towards the clinic, and many prefer to continue their treatment at this children's clinic even after attaining the age for official referral to the adult clinic. He spent some 10 hours per week in direct clinical care of these patients.

Consultant, the Child Abuse Clinic, Transvaal Memorial Institute for Child Health and Development. He spent a day every 2 weeks in this clinic seeing 2-3 new and 2-3 follow-up cases at every clinic.

1995 - 1998 Consultant, Firm B, General Paediatric Unit, Ga-Rankuwa Hospital Responsibilities were similar to those performed at General Paediatric Unit II, Johannesburg Hospital.

#### August 1997 - 2007

Head, Collaborative Endocrinology and Metabolism Unit (CEMU),

The endocrine services of the Departments of Medicine and Paediatrics were amalgamated. Tertiary care Endocrinology patients were seen at the CEMU clinic. Patients were assessed, the diagnosis determined, and appropriate special investigations and admissions planned.

The staffing comprised the Head, one consultant Physician, one consultant Paediatrician and one Internal Medicine, Paediatric and Chemical Pathology registrar each. There wers also a fully trained Diabetes Nurse, and two other registered nurses, involved in patient care and education.

#### 2008 – 2015

Head, Paediatric Endocrine Clinic, Ga-Rankuwa Hospital Deals with clinical care of children with diabetes and endocrine abnormalities. (The Collaborative Endocrinology and Metabolism Unit was dissolved by the Professor of Internal Medicine, insisting that there be separate Medical and Paediatric Clinics.)

2013 – 2015

Head, Paediatric Endocrine Unit.

In 2013, the clinic became an HPCSA accredited subspeciality training Unit, which trained the first Fellow in 2014-2015.
